#### **Scams and Fraud Increase**

A Darley Safer Neighbourhood Police officer attended a recent local coffee morning and advised that there has been a significant increase in the incidence of scams particularly by phone and online.

There are many different types of scam, but the following tips will help you protect against financial fraud.

A genuine bank or organisation will never contact you out of the blue to ask for your PIN, full password or to move money to another account. Only give out your personal or financial details to use a service that you have given your consent to, that you trust and that you are expecting to be contacted by.

Don't be tricked into giving a fraudster access to your personal or financial details. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text.

Always question uninvited approaches, as it may be a scam. Instead contact the company directly using a known email or phone number.

# Former Aida Site Development Update

Lathams, the architects commissioned by the Council have produced four concept proposals for a housing development on the former Aida site on City Rd. Derby Homes initial preferred option (no 2 of the four) is a three storey development comprising 22 x three bed maisonettes & 2 bed apartments built into the rear of the retained façade; plus 24 x 1,2 &3 bed flats built around a courtyard to the northern end of the site; plus 13 x 4 & 5 bed family houses at the rear(west) of the site.

The current intention is for the properties to be council housing but financial viability appraisal may require an element of private housing for sale and /or more units. Further appraisal is underway.

The LCRA have said that based on previous surveys of residents, we would like to see an element of larger family housing available for residents of Chester Green, either private freehold or shared ownership, if a residential development were to be built.

A further meeting with the LCRA is to be arranged in February and the Council have promised they will be consulting more widely.



# Work Plan Report from Our City Our River Flood Defence Project

City Road - Digging of the tree pits should be completed by end of January

**Aida Bliss** – gated car park in the City Road Garages area for Aida's use will be finished end of January.

**City Road Car Park** - Once height restrictor and bollards are installed, the car park will open. (The timescales are 3 weeks to manufacture and then 1 week installation)

**Darley Playing Fields** Mow strip and bund to be completed at Darley by end of January. Path to be completed mid-February 2019. Street furniture will be completed around Darley car park by mid-February.

**Duke Street** - Mow strips are complete. Top soiling and snagging will be complete by end of January 2019 when the site compound will be cleared.
