LITTLE CHESTER RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION Flood Defence and City Road Sites

The Council's Chief Executive Officer Carol Mills, has replied to our letter regarding concerns about local flood protection and the Council's proposals to build housing on the former Aida site.

We asked the question "Why was the decision taken by the Council to continue to build the Chester Green flood defences to a specification that was breached in 2015 (in other parts of the country)?.

The Council and Environment Agency (EA) have replied that the EA designs were costed and approved prior to 2016 as of when the EA increased their recommended standard of protection from '1 in 100' plus 5% climate change allowance to '1 in 100' plus 30% climate change allowance.

The amendment followed incidents of flood walls being overtopped in other parts of the country.

They say the cost and delays of amending and increasing the protection levels of the OCOR scheme would have been prohibitive.

The EA's Regional Advisor has commented that "Any scheme can be subject to flood events that exceed the designed flood protection" and "the EA would obviously prefer business developments over residential developments behind flood defences as they have a lower level of risk"

We also asked "Whether you share our concerns that if housing development on the former Aida site were to be prohibited and Derby City Council having rejected Great Northern Classics' proposals for a less vulnerable non residential Heritage Vehicle Training scheme, that this site with its many constraints, is unlikely to be developed and likely to remain derelict in the future at great cost to DCC?.

Carol Mills responded saying "We're committed to the redevelopment of the Aida Bliss site and our preference is for a housing use on this site. The questions you raise about housing on this site will be tested through the planning process".
