Aida/Bliss Factory (Union Foundry)

Three weeks ago, we started an ePetition to ask Derby City Council to reconsider allowing non-residential development of the Aida/Bliss factory (Union Foundry). The council have turned down the GNC Heritage Vehicle and Skills centre in favour of redeveloping the site entirely for social housing. It is still our belief that the council still isn't aware of all the complexities of this site (two major developers having failed to get through the planning stage previously) whereas using the factory building for non-residential is an easy win.

We submitted the 451 signatures and comments from our ePetition to Derby Council on 10th July. Thanks all, for signing, commenting and sharing. We await their response. Do look at our facebook page/website for more details.

Aida/Bliss Latest

Chris Morgan, Principal Housing Regeneration Officer, has written to say that Council Planning and OCOR officers recently met with the Environment Agency (EA) to discuss flood issues relating to housing development on the Aida Bliss site.

The LCRA requested last year that the Council meet with the EA on this issue. It has now taken place, but only after the Council's rejection of the GNC proposal for a non residential Heritage Vehicle Training Centre.

Chris has said that the meeting believed that a housing scheme on the site, situated in high risk Flood Zone 3a was "viable whilst challenging".

There remain concerns that:

 a residential development will expose additional residents and emergency services to flood risk if flood walls were breached.

- a large residential development will create additional parking, congestion and air quality problems.
- a residential development is likely to require the partial/complete destruction of the historic and internationally important Union Foundry building.
- if housing is to be built that it should be low density larger family housing and preferably with some ownership options available.
- more high density flats are not needed in Chester Green.

Chris Morgan has agreed to meet with members of the Planning subgroup of Darley Neighbourhood Board on 23.07.19 to further discuss the issue so we will keep you informed.

Waterside/Bridge Inn Plans

Planning permission has once again been sought at the Waterside Inn for a change of use into offices and flats.

Our City Our River News (OCOR)

1) Darley Abbey Path - The archaeological surveys found nothing of significance and construction of the path has commenced. The first 200m of the path has now been constructed up to base course level. The final surface for the whole path will be laid in one operation at the end of construction. As



the scheme progresses we are spreading soil in areas where the informal path had been eroded and hopefully once the grass recovers these will disappear. The detailed design work for the new bridge and boardwalk continues.

2) Package 1 Development Sites:

Aida Bliss – A contract has been awarded for work to start on the demolition at the rear of Aida to make way for the flood defences construction.

City Rd Business Centre (former Tomlinsons) works also commenced to demolish the buildings to allow construction of the defences. Plan is for both sites to have completed the watertight stage of construction by the end of the year.

- 3) Cricket Pavilion Proposals for refurbishment of the Cricket Pavilion being worked up, and details of the improvement works to the cricket facilities. The detailed proposals need to be approved by a number of key stakeholders including Historic and Sport England but it is hoped that the works will be completed by next summer.
- 4) OCOR GBV Package 1 Works The final stages of snagging are being completed.
- 5) Landscaping Re-instatement is underway with the majority of the sites seeded now. The new grass areas are to be maintained by the contractor for the first year. Also much of the new tree and shrub planting has been carried out now and is subject to 5 years maintenance by the contractor. All remaining reinstatement will be carried out this autumn.
- 6) Sports provision at Darley Fields Work is underway to construct new tennis courts, multi-use games areas and fitness area. The tennis courts are almost complete now. It is hoped that the courts will be completed by the end of August after which the surrounding areas can be reinstated.
