Metal Detecting and Hole Digging

A Metal Detectorist was recently witnessed digging numerous holes on Parkers Piece.

This is not permitted under the Parks Byelaws as well as the Ancient Monument legislation, so is illegal and a police matter.

Any incident such as this can be reported to the Park Rangers at Darley Fields during the day or to the Parks team phone on **01332 640789**.

The Park Rangers are not able to respond in the evening but the Council now have a team of Public Protection Officers who work in the evening and are following up this recent incident.

Motor Bike racing on Darley Playing Fields Car Park

Residents on Old Chester Rd have complained about motor bikers noisily speeding around Darley Playing Fields Car Park in the evening/night time.

Speed humps are due to be installed in the car park once construction of the sports facilities are complete. These were suggested by the Residents Association and agreed to by the Council due to concerns that vehicle speeding/noise problems would occur and it is hoped this measure will be effective.

In the meantime, residents should report incidents to the Police.

Speeding on City Rd and Old Chester Rd

There has been a noticeable increase in reports of speeding on City Rd and Old Chester Rd since flood defence works and

heavy construction vehicle movements have decreased.

The speed calming scheme was voted for by residents in 2016 but its installation was delayed in order to avoid excessive noise and possible damage from heavy construction vehicles involved in the flood defence works.

Unfortunately it has recently been confirmed that due to an undercosting of the agreed scheme by Council transport engineers, there is a funding shortfall preventing implementation of the scheme.

The solution is to obtain section 106 funding of infrastucture from a relevant development scheme.

The Anachrome Jigs site opposite the Waterside Inn on Mansfield Rd has had planning approved for apartments and section 106 funding is being agreed between the Council and the Developer. The Residents Association are persuing this source of funding to cover the shortfall on the speed calming scheme so the speed humps can be installed.

lation. The Park Rangers are not able to respond in the evening but we now have a team of Public Protection Officers who work in the evening and will be visiting the site from next week. At all other times, please call the police on 101 and report as a heritage crime, as this will then be passed to Emerson Buckingham PC 2581 Rural, Wildlife, Cites and Heritage Crime Officer.

- 2) Darley Park Path The surfaced path is now approaching the new bridge a distance of around 650m. The current section comes quite close to some of the mature trees so care has been taken to ensure the roots are protected. It is our intention to fully surface this part and open it to the public before we move to the other end of the park to start on the section between the play area and Deans Field car park. The new Bridge and Boardwalk should be completed in the next week or two and again this will be opened up for public use.
- 3) Package 1 Development Sites: Aida Bliss The demolition at the rear of Aida Bliss and the City Rd Business Centre (former Tomlinson's) is underway to make way for the flood defences construction. It is planned for both sites to have completed the watertight stage of construction by the end of the year.
- 4) Cricket Pavilion The details of the proposals are waiting for planning approval. It is proposed that the pavilion be fully refurbished and modernised as a cricket pavilion with changing facilities, kitchen and social space. The front ramp is to be altered to give level access into the building and a reinforced grass access track will allow for disabled and vehicular access to the pavilion. The cricket pitch is to be renovated with minor levelling of the surface, new cricket square including an artificial wicket, sand banding and re-seeding. Also cricket practice nets are to be installed. It is anticipated that the works to the cricket pitch will be carried out this autumn and that the facilities will be ready for use summer 2020.
- 5) OCOR GBV Package 1 Works The final stages of work are being completed.
- 6) Landscaping A small number of trees have been vandalised and will be replaced this autumn. The remaining areas will be seeded early autumn with the remaining planting following on during the planting season.
- 7) Sports provision at Darley Fields Construction work is complete. The multi-use games area (MUGA) is open. The tennis court locks are still to be fitted.
