

Q - Where is the Little Chester Library?



during this time. This has involved the pleasures of distance meetings and modern technology which has allowed us to continue developing plans and we are now approaching a very exciting stage.

The Council are very keen to ensure that the new development will be somewhere that Derby can be proud of and they have moved an awful long way from the original plans for a high-density development.

Whilst Bliss' site is still going to be housing, the Council is now very happy with the idea that whatever is built must be in keeping with the existing heritage building and the local conservation area and community such that it will actually add to our way of life rather than being dumped upon us.

Very stringent design criteria were set up, and thirteen companies were invited to submit plans and bids, and these have been now whittled down to five (for the want of a better word) finalists.

In the design and build of the new development, whilst the cost of the project is obviously very important (tax payers' money must not be wasted), the quality of the build and its design are being classed as twice the importance than that of the final cost.

Once the final developer has been appointed, the actual detailed planning of the design will be undertaken and I am assured that there will be a large and (dreadful word) meaningful discussion and consultation with our local community so that we will be able to input into the final design. It is hoped that the complete development will be completed by the end of 2021 or early 2022 but obviously this has been affected and will continue to be affected by the Covid-19 emergency. By the time that the next esteemed copy of the Chester Green newsletter is published, I hope to be able to give you much more detail of what is going on, but it is critical to know that it is only through the strength of community opinion in Chester Green that these changes and alterations have occurred.
