**CHESTER GREEN COMMUNITY CENTRE**


A caretaker is required for Chester Green Community Centre on a self employed basis, working as and when required for a few hours a week.

**PARKER'S PIECE:** Works are still underway at Parkers Piece to bring the Pavilion and cricket ground back into use.

Arrangements with Community One are progressing and it is hoped that cricket will return to the site summer 2022.

To support the venture a planning application is being submitted for a storage unit adjacent to the pavilion for essential grounds maintenance equipment.

This is also an opportunity to incorporate artwork and interpretation of the historic significance of the site.

It is anticipated that the unit will be installed early spring 2022.

**Burglaries and Thefts** - There have unfortunately been a number of burglaries and thefts reported in Chester Green recently.

It is important to secure doors, windows, gates and property, particularly due to the open nature of many back gardens in the area. A recent break in was made via a small window closure left partially open.

Garden sheds containing valuable tools, equipment and pedal cycles are also a target for thieves. The Police recommend sturdy locks and shed alarms for garden sheds and good quality locks and security marking for pedal cycles.

Another local incident involved a cold caller selling goods on the doorstep who used a diversionary tactic to gain entry and steal cash.

The Darley Safer Neighbourhood Team can advise on security and can be contacted by ringing 101. If you witness anyone committing a crime or acting suspiciously do call the Police on 999.

**Community First Responder scheme** - Darley Abbey Community Association have launched fund raising to establish an East Midlands Ambulance Service Community First Responder Scheme in the local area.

Community First Responders (CFRs) are volunteers who respond to 999 calls alongside the ambulance service. They provide care before an ambulance arrives.

All CFRs are local, operate in charitable schemes of 6 to 25 volunteers, and 'log on' according to their availability. The role was originally created to deliver CPR and defibrillation to patients in cardiac arrest, however the training and capabilities of CFRs have expanded to attend a wider variety of calls and more patients.

Community First Responders need no prior medical knowledge or training. All training is provided by East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS). Initial training takes 3 days, after 12 months 'on call' a CFR is eligible to undertake 2 days additional training. Costs are split between EMAS and the scheme fundraising in the local community.

CFRs provide essential treatment in those crucial first few minutes before an ambulance arrives and can save lives.
