MARV Film Studio proposal for Aida Bliss site

A full planning application is expected to be submitted in the near future but for now plans have been submitted seeking "full planning permission on a temporary basis for nine months to utilise the rear modern highbay shed (part of the site) for film-making purposes".



It says that film-making operations will take place typically

between 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday during the temporary occupation period "for a maximum of 50 employees at the peak activity (during filming) on site".

The council's Environment officer has requested more information regarding noise levels; the target date for a decision on the temporary planning application is mid September.

Unauthorised Encampments on Chester Green

Following the two recent encampments on Chester Green, the first consisting of 38 vehicles and the second of 26 vehicles, and following the concerns raised by residents and councillors to the Council and the Police, we understand that senior officers of Derby City Council are now actively looking at a wide range of possible physical measures to prevent or seriously deter future incursions onto Chester Green including their suitability and affordability. They are also to examine whether there is sufficient evidence to obtain a permanent injunction to prevent or seriously deter future incursions in the future. A number of senior DCC Officers will report back their findings and recommendations when they have finished their work.

The Residents Association have also written to DCC's Strategic Director with responsibility for community safety, requesting that the council produce a documented risk assessment of the dangers to the public, particularly children, of trespasser's vehicles driving around the Green and on public footpaths. DCC have a legal duty to identify hazards, assess the seriousness of the risk and take actions to eliminate or control the risk and to document the process.
