MARV Film Studio proposal for Aida Bliss site

The Council have approved the planning application for "full planning permission on a temporary basis for nine months to utilise the rear modern highbay shed (part of the site) for film-making purposes".

The application says that film-making operations will take place typically between 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday during the temporary occupation period "for a maximum of 50 employees at the peak activity (during filming) on site".

A number of planning conditions have been imposed including "that no explosive charges will be used unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Local Planning Authority".

Planning Application to demolish the 'Duke of Clarence' on Mansfield Rd

A planning application (ref. 22/01085) has been submitted to demolish the Duke of Clarence pub and erect a four storey building with a ground floor micro pub and eleven apartments.

The expiry date for public comments was 26th September and at the time of writing 25 objections have been submitted so the application should be heard and decided at Planning Control Committee.

Objections submitted include the grounds that the pub is a historic building in Little Chester Conservation Area, the proposed four storey contempory design would negatively impact the nearby Grade 2 listed buildings and that the submitted viability assessment which states that demolition is the only viable option is incorrect.
