CITY ROAD GATEWAY PROJECT

A meeting was held last month where a number of people present agreed to join a working group to look at what can be done to improve the appearance of City Road (Mansfield Rd. end) as a gateway into the Little Chester Conservation Area and World Heritage Site Buffer Zone. We're still looking for more people to join!

Neighbourhood Officers will take tackle the physical improvements clearly needed, looking at the wall and razor wire/half demolished building and will arrange a meeting with landowners and heritage officers to progress this.

More discussion around the community involvement and ideas is needed to formulate a plan – the Art idea was discussed and would need to be discussed more widely as Art tends to be personal and what one group like others may not. The idea for a community mural was also discussed possibly speaking to the group that painted the Falcons on the Silk Mill, but again, it would need to come from the community as to whether it is a good idea and what they would like to see.

The message for the community is that the area is in need of an uplift led by the Community.


Enjoy a break with some mulled wine or cider, hot chocolate with cakes and mince pies – never mind the calories!!

UPDATE ON REQUEST TO THE COUNCIL TO PREVENT FURTHER UNAUTHORISED ENCAMPMENTS ON THE GREEN

Following the two unauthorised encampments by large numbers of people on the Green in July and August, and complaints submitted by many local residents via our ward councilors, the Council agreed "*to review options around injunctions, the new powers and other physical preventative measures to prevent encampments occurring*".

The new powers referred to are 'section 61' powers under the recently amended Criminal Justice and Public Order Act 1994 which permits the Police to immediately remove unauthorised encampments without involvement of the courts.

In fact the government's Home Office enforcement guidance states:

"There are locations where immediate action to remove them [unauthorized encampments] should be taken because the presence of the encampment is seriously disrupting the ability of the settled community to make use of facilities or to conduct their business, for instance: on school grounds during term time; on urban parks..."

The Green is both an urban park and used by Landau Forte schoolchildren during term time.

A response from the Council for a proposed scheme to plant three trees, locate a bench and relocate a bin to prevent vehicle access via the dropped kerb at the corner of Mansfield Rd and Chester Green Rd was felt to be wholly inadequate, so a meeting with council officers to further discuss the issue is being requested by the Neighbourhood Board.
